The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many

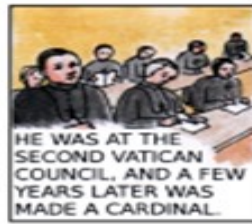
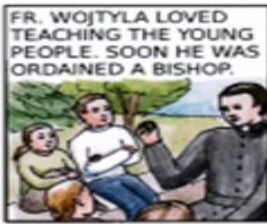
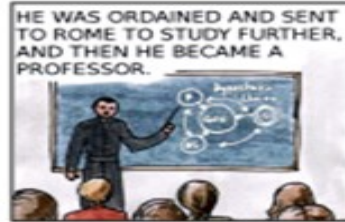
Jesus called the Twelve to him and said to them,
