

## THIS SUNDAYS READING THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C

#### First Reading

Micah 5:2-5a

Thus says the Lord: You, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

Therefore, he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel.

And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth. And he shall be their peace.

Responsorial Psalm: Bring us back, O God; let your face shine forth, and we shall be saved.

#### Second reading

Hebrews 10:5-10

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came into the world, he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, "Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book."

When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings' (these are offered according to the Law), then he added, 'Behold, I have come to do your will'. He does away with the first in order to establish the second. And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Alleluia, alleluia. Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord;

let it be to me according to your word. Alleluia.

#### Gospel

Luke 1:39-45

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and she exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!

And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy.

And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her from the Lord.'

#### Advent Prayer and reflection for the Fourth Sunday of Advent

We listen to your word as it whispers in our hearts 'do not be afraid. **Come, Lord, prince of peace.** 

Be with all who suffer because of conflict and violence and strengthen those who seek peace. **Come, Lord, prince of peace.** 

Lead us in your ways, as together we make a change and share your peace with all.



#### Advent—4th Sunday Reflection

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a teenage girl to inform her that she would be the mother of God, Jesus. This well-known account is acted out in primary schools across the United Kingdom. I have fond memories, as a very proud father, watching my daughter singing this announcement when she was only six years old! But let us not be fooled by the romantic imagery of a children's nativity play. This "Fiat" of Mary was the biggest "yes" ever made by a human. God asked her to carry God in her womb so that the redemption of the world could take place. She risked being rejected by Joseph and/or being stoned to death. Her "yes" went against all logical thinking; she moved against the stream of humanity so that God could have His will and save the world from the darkness that humans had created. Her "yes" brought God's light into the world once again. As we start to look at the next jubilee year, "Pilgrims of Hope", let us consider our "yes" to God. We, too, need to help bring into the world the light of Christ. We can do this by listening to the word that God is giving to us individually and then responding with our "yes". This could be going against the modern world's thinking, going against the tide. Mary overcame her fear and said "yes" to the angel Gabriel. Do we have the courage and strength to listen to God and stand up for what is right for the world? Are we ready to go against the tide and follow God's will? Mary was a young teenager, but her "yes" transformed the world. Let us open up our minds and actions so that we, too, can be tools for God's plans. Let us listen to Him and be "Pilgrims of Hope" in this needy world.



### Fourth Sunday of Advent (Year C) Luke 1:39-45



'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!



Just as Mary showed her love for her cousin Elizabeth by going to visit her, we can show our love for other people this Advent.

How we can show love?
