Reflections for Holy Week 2025

As we journey through Holy Week, we walk the path of Christ, tracing His steps from triumph to suffering, from the Cross to the empty tomb. It is not just a remembrance but a pilgrimage – one that invites us to enter more deeply into the mystery of our faith. Like all pilgrims, we carry burdens, questions, and hopes.

On Palm Sunday we join the crowds in their joy, yet we know that the road ahead leads to suffering. In the upper room on Holy Thursday, we receive the gift of Christ's love and self-giving.

On Good Friday, we stand at the foot of the Cross, where grace and sorrow meet. And in the silence of Holy Saturday we wait in expectation, longing for the dawn of Easter morning.

This pilgrimage through Holy Week is not only Christ's journey – it is ours. We are pilgrims of hope, called to walk with faith, trusting that the suffering of Good Friday is not the end, but the beginning of new life. The empty tomb of Easter Sunday reminds us that hope is never in vain. As we walk this sacred path, I pray that these reflections accompany you through Holy Week helping you embrace the hope that Christ offers – a hope that transforms darkness into light, despair into joy, and death into resurrection.



Myanmar Disaster Appeal (a Special Second Collection) 19 April

The Bishop has written to parishioners about the disaster, (in summary):

I'm sure you have heard about the devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake that struck Myanmar Friday 28 March. Whilst detailed news reporting is difficult, we know through our Church networks that the devastation is significant.

The Catholic community in parishes are to donate directly to CAFOD, so we can priorities support through our Church partners. We ask Catholic parishes to hold collections for the people of Myanmar at Masses in the next few weeks.

St Patrick will have a 2nd collection 19 April 2025.

I wish you a blessed Holy Week and a joyful Easter. Thank you for your prayers for our sisters and brothers in Myanmar. We pray for those who have died, for healing for the injured and for comfort for those who have lost loved ones, homes and livelihoods. We pray especially for our Church partners as they reach out to those affected by this disaster.

Thank you, as ever, for your support for CAFOD this Lent.
